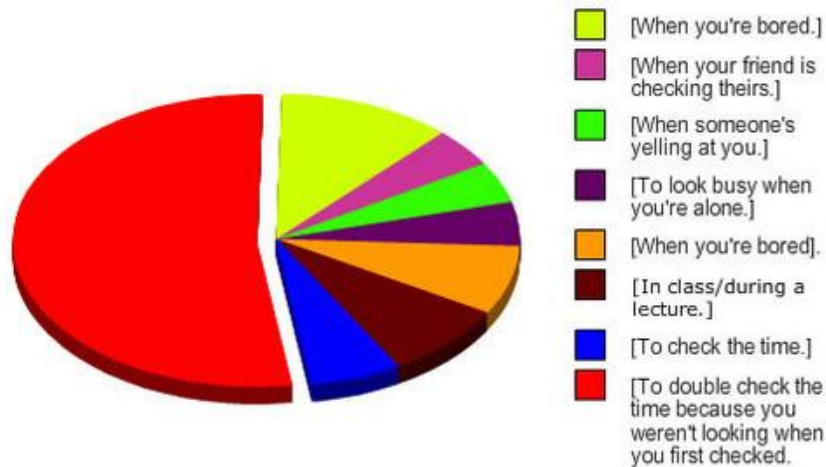


Introduction

Cellphone use

- Cell phone use has been increasing over the years
- 78% of Canadian households indicated they had a cell phone in 2010, a 4% increase from 2008
- 13% states they use a cell phone and no landline

When You Look At Your Cell Phone



Opportunity

The danger

- Walking and browsing:
 - 61.2 % of students surveyed at the University of Tsukuba said they frequently collide with passerby's when using mobile devices while walking.
- Texting and driving:
 - “...the impairment a driver experiences using a cell phone equals that of a person driving with a blood-alcohol content of .08 percent” – University of Utah
 - Alberta’s legal limit is 0.08%
- General distracted driving:
 - “Driving while distracted (DWD) is responsible for 25% of all car accidents, with many of those coming from the distractions of using cell phone or other mobile device.” – University of Utah
 - “The amount of brain activity devoted to driving may decrease by as much as 37 percent when using a cell phone.” – Carnegie Mellon University



Action

Don't drive or walk and text!

- Don't risk your safety, and the safety of those around you, by checking your cellphone while driving or walking.

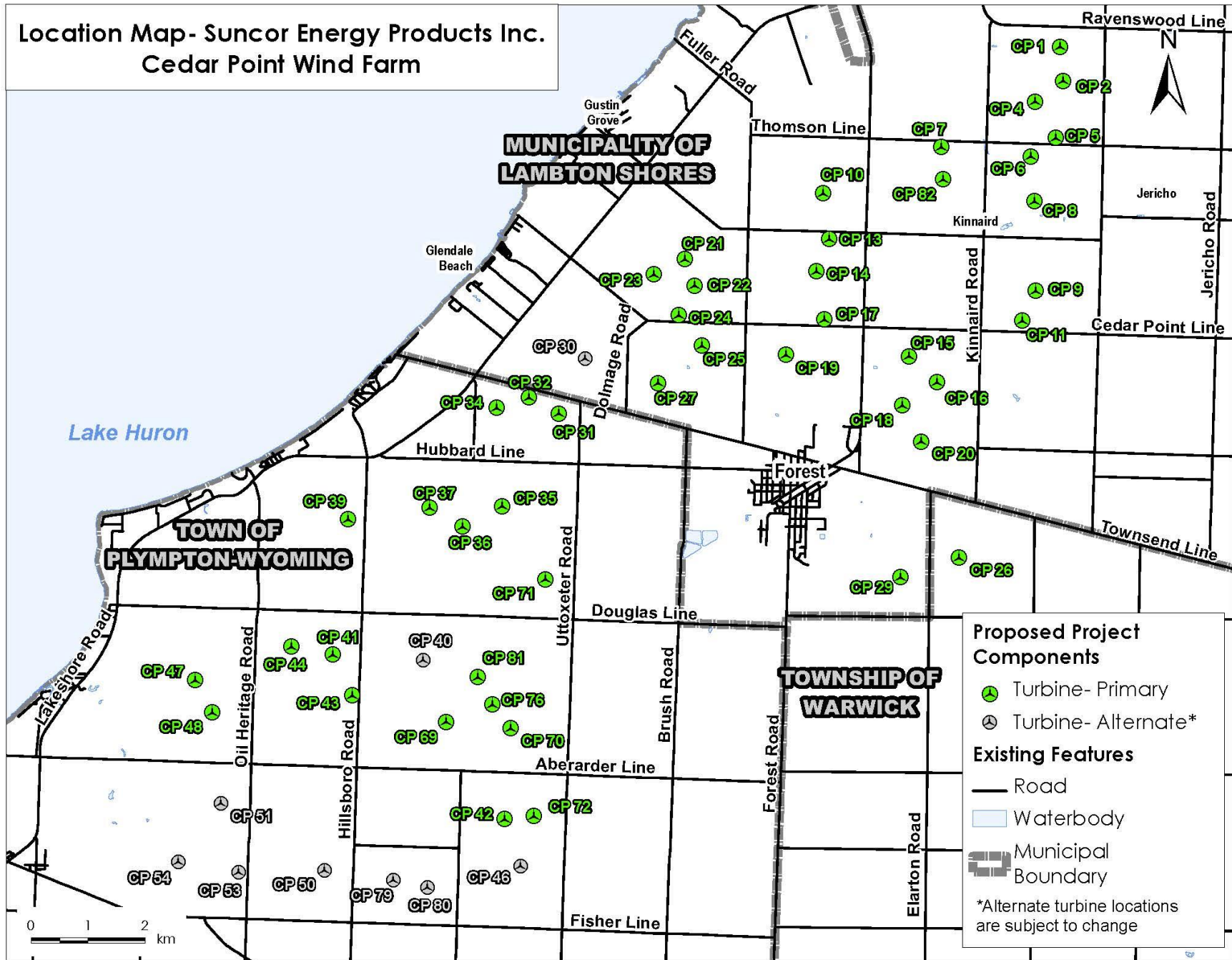
